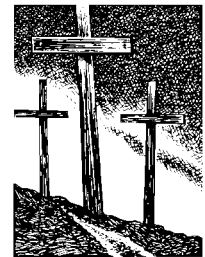
Procession of the Palms

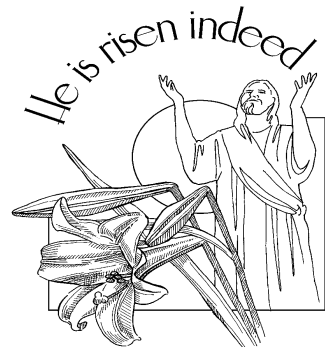


MAUNDY THURSDAY, April 1, 7:30 p.m. - The communion service commemorates the Last Supper Jesus shared with his disciples when Jesus showed his disciples the marks of his Kingdom were Humility and Service. Fifth graders who have attended Pastor's class will receive their First Communion and participate in the foot washing.

GOOD FRIDAY, April 2, 8 p.m. - The Tenebrae Service - a modern version of the ancient Service of Darkness that begins in light and slowly descends into darkness as the candles are extinguished, symbolizing the death of Christ and the consequences of SIN. "Good" Friday because of Christ's death God conquers evil and forgives our sin.



EASTER VIGIL - During this Vigil from 9:00 p.m., Good Friday to dawn on Easter, we will "keep the Word alive" at the foot of the cross, by reading from the Gospel and various prayer litanies appropriate to the passion. Individuals will read for one-half hour periods or more. The Bible and prayer books will be on the altar. When it is your turn, proceed to the altar and relieve the previous reader. A sign-up sheet is posted in the narthex.

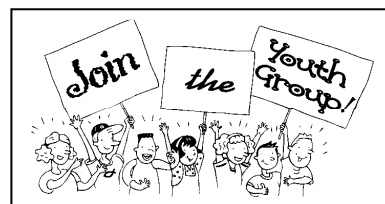

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As some of you know, part of every intern's learning process is the internship project. Many of you also are aware that my project is well under way. For those of you who do not know, my project has been to analyze the results of the U.S. Congregational Life survey that St. Matthew's took part in back in the fall of 2008. That survey was conducted nationwide and across Christian denominations. The compilation of how you answered the sixty-question survey was sent to us along with analyses of how our data compared to the other 2,305 participating congregations. One of these forms of comparison was a Strengths Report. Ten possible strengths of churches were determined by the surveyors, which were established by comparing representative questions from the survey data. For example, our responses to five of the survey questions were compared against the responses to same questions nationwide to determine that "Focusing on the Community" is our top strength.

Along with a vibrant Social Ministry, "Caring for Young People" and "Empowering Leadership" round out our top three strengths. Together these three form the heart of the particular identity of St. Matthew's within the Lutheran Christian Church, which has been intentionally nurtured since its inception. Consequently, these are strong building blocks, laid on the foundation of Christ, upon which we can continue to build and vision the future here. In fact, I believe our care for others, inside and outside of our walls, and the strong leadership in doing so is why so many responded to the survey that they are committed to our direction for ministry and mission. When I have presented this information to the committees here, I have joked that we do not want to handle this success as my Steelers have, who missed the playoffs both seasons after winning the Super Bowl. Instead, we need to be vigilant in maintaining these strengths. One way to accomplish this will be intentionally seeking out the input and involvement of our youth and young adults as programs are planned and carried out, which will also contribute to the bolstering of one of our reported weaknesses "Participating in the Congregation."

Not every category can be a strength, so there are some that fall into the range of going well but for a variety of reasons do not register as a comparative strength. "Meaningful Worship," "Welcom-

ing New Worshippers," "Having a Sense of Belonging," and "Looking to the Future" are the categories that fall here. However that still leaves three categories that are weaknesses. As previously mentioned, "Participation" is one of these, but surprisingly so, because thanks to all of you, we have much better than average involvement in small group activities and programs, such as SCS and fellowship events. Besides a lower representation of young adults by percent, the main reason this category is a weakness is that only 42% of the 212 surveyed give 5% or more of their net income compared against 56% of Lutherans nationwide. Our much higher average income is one explanation for these numbers and why we are able to fund much Benevolence, but it also indicates that there is still room for growth. Despite a large majority of people reporting that their spiritual needs are being met, "Growing Spiritually" is also a reported weakness, so the Christian Education committee is looking at ways to highlight and grow the spiritual discipline of prayer as a response to this information. Finally, the Evangelism committee is developing a workshop about recognizing and responding to opportunities to share our faith since "Sharing Faith" was our lowest ranked category. Although committee members are looking at these issues, everyone is encouraged to seek ways to join in the effort to make St. Matthew's an even better place through these and other means.

Thank you to those who have heard and engaged my reports on the survey, either in committees or in my SCS presentation. Whether this is your first time encountering this information or your tenth, as always, if you have any questions or would like to discuss it further feel free to contact me.

The Drop-In Center for the Homeless

St. Matthew's supports the Drop-In Center through our benevolence dollars, meal support, dinners at CiCi's and designated offerings such as the Personal Care Kits collected in March. You may wonder exactly what the Drop-In Center is and how it supports those in need in the county. Below is information from the Center describing their mission.

What We Are

- A daytime program providing a place where homeless men and women can get out of the cold or heat, snow or rain, and meet staff and volunteers who genuinely care about them
- We provide an atmosphere of safety and trust where the homeless are assisted in making life changes
- We've played a key role in helping 20 individuals move from living in tents in the woods without housing

What We Do

We reach out to about 50 homeless men and women each day in Prince William County by providing the following:

- Meals
- Showers
- Clothing
- Employment assistance
- A telephone number and address
- Assistance finding housing
- An on-site social worker/counselor
- Assistance making medical and dental appointments
- Assistance with prescriptions
- Tents, sleeping bags, blankets, coats, hats, gloves and other supplies.

The Drop-In Center is located at 14730 Potomac Mills Road in Woodbridge next to the main PRTC bus terminal.
